

## Overlook staging Areas

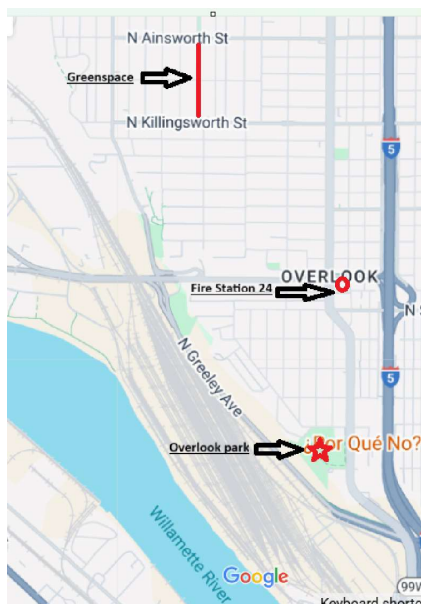
- **Green Space:** N. Omaha Ave between Killingsworth and N. Ainsworth St
- **Overlook Park:** 1599 N Fremont St, Portland OR 97227

**Additional staging areas may be used - leave markings at the above locations to indicate where.**

## Fire Station

### Fire Station 24 [OK-PFD] - N Going & Maryland

- Likely to be very busy
- Due to no active BEECN site in Overlook AROs may choose to deploy here or their own home whichever is deemed safer



## NET Team Safety is Priority: Hazards to be aware of for Overlook Neighborhood

### Lethal chemical gas/Smoke plumes:

- Can be lethal in under 15 min
- Any lung irritation felt → Shelter in place with plastic & tape
  - **Masks will NOT protect you**
- Duration of sheltering unknown but expect at least 12 hours
- Low lying areas (basements) take longer for lethal chemicals to dissipate

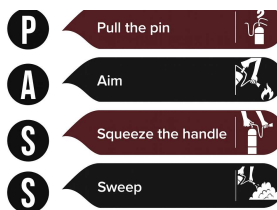
### Other Hazards:

- Unreinforced masonry building will be a falling debris risk
- Older homes will likely shift from their foundations and fall into basement
- Liquefaction, ground deformation and landslide events likely
- Assume all bridges and overpass are unsafe for even foot traffic to use
- Be prepared to take alternative routes
- Vehicle traffic may increase in unusual areas

**Remain in physical contact, watch floor and ceiling, do not turn your back to the**

**fire**



# Overlook NET Team Ops Plan

**Only use:** When Normal communications channels are impacted by a major earthquake event.

If normal communications are open Portland Bureau of Emergency Management (PBEM) will deploy nets on a case by case basis.

**No NET Team Member should perform any duties alone!!!**



## Radio Communications

### FRS Radio Channels

Primary: Ch 05      Secondary: Ch 15

**Note:** FRS distance limitations - radio communications may not span the entirety of the overlook neighborhood

**GMRS Radios:** Be prepared to include their household registered callsign

### Radio Etiquette & Use

#### Only one person at a time can transmit

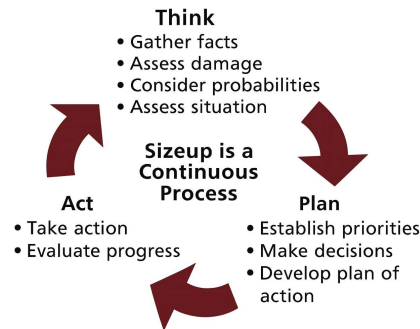
- Press key – wait a ½ a second – talk
- [Recipient], this is [your description], please respond
- Wait for recipient’s acknowledgment before transmitting message
- Communicate slowly & simply. Focus on vital info (who, what, when, where, why, how many)
- Note: Affirmative or Negative for yes or no, Use Say again or I say again for repeat information
- Use your radio lock feature if equipped to aid in lowering false transmissions

### Staging area protocol

- “Unsafe” or "Site Bad" marking: Add your initials/date/time and proceed to the next closest staging area.
- “Safe” or "Site OK” team is present: Check in with Incident Command.
- If no one is present / no markings found: You may be the first NET to arrive.
- Assume role as de facto Incident Commander. You may hand off the role later, if needed.

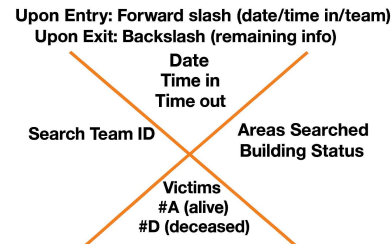
## Scene Size Up

- Use caution
- **Look up:** Damaged power lines, trees, or changing weather
- **Look down:** Pooling water, leaking contaminants, tripping hazards
- **Look & smell:** Use all your senses
- **Listen:** For alarms or hissing



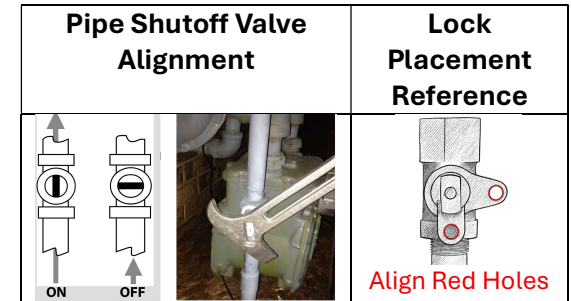
## Search & Rescue

### Minimum 2 NET trained individuals per entry



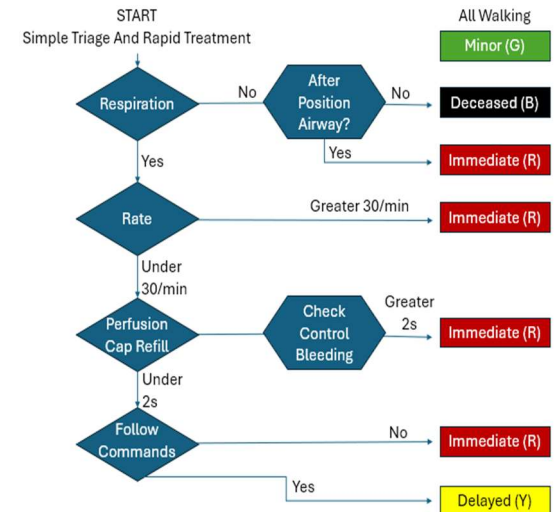
## Gas Meter Shut off

Only use the non-sparking emergency tool for this task
