

Spring 2025 After Action Report

Held on May 31, 2025 1-4PM

The objectives were:

- Neighboring team communications
- Forms 201 and 8
- Dealing with well meaning neighbors who want to donate food/supplies
- Sanitation

Activities Conducted Based on Objectives

All teams made progress on the objectives outlined for the exercise:

- Teams were challenged to complete form ISC 201
- Teams were presented setting up a sanitation station
- Each team used FRS/GMRS radios for intra-team communication; AROs communicated with MCARES Bravo Team at the EOC
- Teams were asked to attempt to reach a neighboring team via FRS radio
- How do teams handle well meaning neighbors who arrive with donations

What do participants want to focus on for the Fall 2025 CDE

Exercise participants identified several items that need continued focus in the next CDE:

- Working with (and organizing) forms
- Working with other teams
- More medical practice
- Additional radio communication
- Setting up ICS structure
- Search & Rescue techniques

Comments from participants

- I liked that it was based on a real historical event from the region
- We needed a tornado drill
- Power poles/lines will always be vulnerable in a tornado situation... Multiple injects were a nice touch
- From easy to more challenging over the course of the three hours
- The Pearl is always a different situation. Broken glass might be the biggest issue...
- Something different from earthquake but many of the injects could apply to earthquakes as well as a tornado
- Touched on topics less covered such as dealing with donations and question of limits to NET authority
- Think about vertical neighborhoods
- Being asked to actually walk around the neighborhood and practice documentation felt really concrete and helpful for thinking about the realities of what a scenario would be like

Exercise Follow-up

The planning committee encouraged each team to conduct a brief “hot wash” immediately following the exercise to report on their experience, give initial reactions to the planning committee through their exercise coordinators, and begin to identify areas where individual teams need to work on improvement and also where the team currently excels so that their skills can be maintained. It appears that most teams were able to have an on scene (or nearby) hot wash.

The planning committee conducted a follow-up survey offered to all exercise participants to gather more in-depth feedback on various aspects of the exercise. The summary feedback is presented in the chart on page two of this report in the Feedback Scores section.

This after-action report will be used in planning future exercises.

How do we approach a small child or infant who are alone?

When do we send communications to certain people? To the staging area, the ARO or the EOC?

Carrying our packs and walking long distanced can be hard and tiring. Some have found that using a few smaller packs (chest pack, fanny pack, etc.) is easier. Also you can pare down your pack if you know you will only need certain items for your assignment.

Make sure to identify yourself to residents as fellow neighbors and volunteers. Some may fear government officials.

Having a Safety Officer was great. They could answer teams questions such as “Can we do that?” “How far back to we need to stay from this?”

Would like to see injects be on a half sheet of paper, uniform size. Easier for Exercise Coordinators to print and assemble and for teams in the field.

Role-plays were a good idea, but would like to have neighbors fill those roles. PBEM is checking to see if we can do this.

There is a new technology called Meshtastic. It can send encrypted text messages. Not reliable yet, but something for the future.

Teams are looking for ways to produce maps showing addresses.



Type of the radio you used during the CDE on May 31st (check all that apply)

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



Rough estimate of height of the base of your antenna **above ground level** (not above sea level) in feet during contacts with subnet control.







Were you able to check into the Resource Net?

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

How well could you hear the Resource Net?

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

How well was your subnet controller able to hear you?

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











How many replies to NET Form 8s did you read to your subnet controller during the exercise?





How many NET Form 8s did you read to your subnet controller?








Would you be interested in serving as a subnet controller in the future?

A video walkthrough of the process would make the instructions more accessible.

I read ALL the instructions and print them (I put them in a special folder that I take to the staging area)--the links in the instructions are useful--however, I wouldn't mind having all the materials in one large PDF--nevertheless, I print them and place them in order so that I can refer to them as needed--on the front of the notebook that holds the instructions, I write a few important pieces of information on the front and I also have a half sheet of blank paper that I write instructions from Resource and/or SNC

I found them to be clear and concise.

More concise and to the point. Too much talking that had no direct purpose. Too many words.



How could these exercises be made more valuable in preparing you to help in an actual emergency?

CDEs are short, but practicing a shift change of subnets and of AROs would be valuable

Resource Net could provide instructions to ARO regarding type of messages the EOC wants to receive during the exercise

Seeing or hearing more examples net form 8s would be helpful, especially with the options for the "to" section and examples of different precedences.

have a review zoom session to go over the instructions--I am not sure everyone reads the instructions--provide examples of filling out the logging form as the example exercise on zoom continues--perhaps video an ARO and as each part of the instructions unfolds, stop the video and show the forms and how to complete them

I think they're pretty good. Practice, with multiple players, helps immensely.

Increase traffic volume (e.g., Subnet Controller - Subnet - NET Teams), Incorporate Winlink.

Subnet controller was off frequency frequently to send traffic on. Needed a second operator to send these and to keep traffic moving.

Team members were shown how long this method of communication takes and understood the need to keep messages brief.

Subnet control was definitely a bottle neck for our team. We had around six form eights to communicate, but there was only time to convey two or three. This could also be a realistic scenario for an emergency. I also value the process of training/exercising SN controllers...so this isn't a criticism or suggestion for changes, per se. In an emergency, I would try to convey the form eights by Winlink, rather than by voice.

The SNC needs to read and review the exercises--several teams just started talking to each other without getting permission from the SNC--the SNC would say he would be gone for a bit to do Winlink but neglected to assign a temporary SNC--also, when the two teams started talking to each other the SNC should have asked them to go to a different frequency and then return to the regional frequency--however, this was a very good exercise and I really enjoyed participating as an ARO--I tried to check into the Southeast region but didn't hear anyone



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



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







How many messages from the Portland EOC radio room did you receive by voice during the exercise?





How many Form 8s or ICS 213s from Portland EOC did you read to the AROs on your subnet during the exercise?





Approximately how many Form 8s did you receive from the AROs in your region during the exercise?





Approximately how many total replies did you receive from AROs to Form 8s or ICS 213s?





A single sheet with bulleted highlights would have been very helpful. The many linked sheets of instructions presented difficulties

I found them clear, I would highlight the need for a scribe.

It felt like I had to assemble the instructions from multiple documents. Something streamlined as a summary might be helpful.

Simplify the instructions and rely less on link documents.

It was a fun exercise and all the AROs did a great job. BTW I handled about 12 replies and 2 additional 213s from the 3 AROs. Responses to ECC were combined when possible.
