PublicAlerts sends urgent safety messages (stay inside, evacuate, or boil water) to:

- Landline phones
- Mobile phones (voice and text)
- Email

To receive messages, you must register at PublicAlerts.org


PublicAlerts is one of many tools we use to notify you. It's not activated in all situations. Depending on the incident, safety information is also provided through:

- TV, radio and newspapers (print and online)
- The Emergency Alert System (EAS) on TV and radio
- Twitter and Facebook
- Wireless Emergency Alerts (WEA) on most mobile phones

Neighborhood Emergency Teams (NET) are Portlanders trained to provide emergency disaster

assistance within their own neighborhoods.

NETs are trained by PBEM and Fire & Rescue to:

- Conduct search and rescue
- Perform medical triage
- Shut off utilities
- Educate others to be prepared, and much more

PBEM coordinates emergencies when disaster strikes. We do this by:

- Keeping the City's Emergency Coordination Center ready to activate at a moment's notice
- Training Portlanders in basic emergency response practices and safe procedures, to aid others without becoming injured
- Overseeing the City's disaster planning and prevention efforts
- Performing community outreach on how to be prepared and resilient
- Conducting emergency training and exercises for City bureaus



A Basic Earthquake Emergency Communication Node (BEECN) is a place to go after a major earthquake to ask for help if phone service is down, report damage, and get safety information.

There are 50 BEECNs around Portland.
